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Project **DELTA (Digital Excavation through Learning and Training in Archaeology)** is a transnational project funded in the context of Erasmus+/KA2 EU programme (Strategic Partnerships for Higher Education) under the coordination of the DAISSy research group of Hellenic Open University. The outcomes of **DELTA** project include:

- the “Digital Excavation” course and teaching handbook;
- the DELTA online learning platform;
- a guide for the adoption of DELTA methodology with a set of good practices.

The DELTA **blended course** is open to all **students of Archaeology** and contains **4 modules**:

1. Digital Tools for Archaeological Practice/Excavation;
2. Documentation in situ and after excavation;
3. Digital Preservation of cultural heritage monuments and artifacts;
4. Open-Air Museums and Experimental Archaeology.

The **200-hours** course offers a total of **8 ECTS** and allows students of Archaeology to update their knowledge and skills and develop **digital** and **21st century skills**. It is delivered via the online platform and includes face to face and on-site learning. Selected students are invited to join multinational groups and participate in a **joint excavation** in the historical place of **Marathon**, Greece. The course is developed by the **4 Universities** involved in the project:

- the DAISSy research group of the Hellenic Open University - Greece
- the Department of History and Archaeology of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens - Greece
- the post-graduate School of Archaeology -DiCEM of the University of Basilicata - Italy
- the Department of Archaeology and Museology of the Masaryk University - Czech Republic
